1. Pray :: About what the Lord will have your group do...ask that God would use your group for His glory.

2. Decide :: as a group how you will serve. Remember that whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it for the Glory of God. You are serving the Lord, not just men. Don't forget to talk with the Community Missions Team and hand in your form.

3. Serve Together :: We already have an existing relationship with the ministry, so you have an opportunity to deepen the relationship. Remember that you have the freedom to share the Gospel! Be sensitive to your ministry context and look for ways to establish conversations and relationships.

4. Give God the Glory & debrief :: This is when most people will make the connection between what they just did and how God used them. Identify other ways you can come back and meet additional needs.

Questions to ask you group:

- What were your expectations? What was your experience?
- Can you identify where God is a work? What is God showing you through this? Do you see how this service is relevant to the Gospel?
- Did you begin to build a relationship with anyone?
- Could this project have gone smoother or better? How?
- How could your group come back and serve again?
- What are other ways we can live out our identity as God's servants?
