1. Read together

- Nehemiah 1:1-2:3

2. Questions:

- Initial thoughts/questions?

- When Nehemiah prayed his prayer, Jerusalem's walls and gates had been destroyed for almost 150 years. Why do you think nothing had been done for so long?

- What are you passionate about? What burden has God given you to help solve?
- As you become a person of passion, how will that lead to action in your life?
